FROM THE MUSIC COMMITTEE



Today's Children's Sunday service reminded me of what can be so extra special about making music in worship. The pre-service bell rehearsal was not good. Each run-through had a different problem. It felt like we hadn't practiced it before. Then we took our places during the service to play, and music came out! I'm amazed every time this happens, and it happens often, as though we have all channeled the Holy Spirit.

In order for our music ministry to function, we do need some help beyond just the music committee. There are three areas in which we are looking for help:

1. We need several people to serve on the Search Committee for a new Music Director. There are no qualifications beyond an interest in our music ministry. Please let one of us (Barb, Rosalee, me) know if you are willing to take on this task.
2. Our sheet music files are crowded and the folders are getting worn out. I'd like help in cataloging all this music by entering title and composer and maybe publisher into an excel spreadsheet. This is a task that can be done in little pieces and at odd times, once I get people oriented. People could use their own laptops and keep their own spreadsheets. Once we have everything entered, we can put the spreadsheets together and make a master file! If you like orderliness, you'll love this job! Please contact me if you can help.
3. Every time we use a piece of music in a service that is broadcast in any way, we must report its use to CCLI and ONE LICENSE. They take care of the royalties for the copyrighted music so that we don't have to. I'd like to have someone else learn the software for those programs, so that I'm not the only person in the congregation who is able to do the weekly reporting. Tech savvy-ness would be helpful. Please contact me to volunteer.

As we look ahead to summer, there are a few things on the horizon.

On the last weekend in June, I'll be attending the biennial Handbell Festival-Conference, in Worcester, sponsored by Area 1 Handbell Musicians of America. It's a weekend of classes (the conference part) and rehearsals for the closing concert (the festival part). I learn all kinds of new things at these events and meet and network with other ringers and directors. The concert will feature about 300 ringers from many choirs, all playing the same pieces. This year the closing concert will be live-streamed. When I get the link, I'll put it in the Friday email blast.

In July, we'll be worshipping at North Hadley Congregational Church. In August, North Hadley will be worshipping with us.

Darrell W. Holland Sr.
April 30, 1932 to November 30, 2024

Darrell Wendell Holland Sr., newspaper writer, editor, ordained Pastor, marathoner and mountain climber, passed away on November 30th, 2024, in Cleveland, Ohio, where he lived for over forty years. He was 92 years old at the time of his passing.

Darrell was born to Ray E. Holland and Esther (Dean) Holland on April 30th, 1932, in Charleston, West Virginia. He was the oldest of five children. He was preceded in death by his parents, Ray and Esther Holland, his brothers, Carol and Kenneth, and his sister, Linda Sue.



He is survived by his wife of more than 50 years, Ann Holland of Ohio and New York, and his sister, Mary Lou Matson of Ohio, West Virginia, and Arizona.

He leaves behind sons Darrell Holland, Jr. (Dianne) and Paul Holland (Lillian) and daughter Joanna Brown (David Suru). His grandchildren include Michael Holland (Michelle), Timothy Holland (Candace), Emily Holland, Seth Brown (Lorena), Grant Holland, and Olivia Weissman (Ian), and eight great-grandchildren (Connor, Dominick, Lawrence, Trenton, Annabel, Emberlee, Ellianna, and Arrowynn).

He earned his Bachelor's degree, a Master's of Divinity, and a Master's of Science in Journalism. He was the Communications Director for the Massachusetts Conference United Church of Christ, pastored several churches, most notably the North Hadley Congregational Church, and from 1974 to 1997, he was the Religion Editor for the Cleveland Plain Dealer Publishing Company in Cleveland, Ohio.

He was active in and passionate about the Civil Rights Movement and all social justice issues, striving to be a voice for those society sought to silence and diminish.

Darrell Holland Sr. will be missed by all who were fortunate enough to know him, especially those blessed to be his family. His warmth, generosity, and spirit were all part of a man who focused on making the world a better place for all who needed a voice. He has been described as someone who “genuinely engaged with and had so much time and energy for everyone (including strangers).”

“Darrell was always interested in talking with people he met on hiking, biking, and other trips. He was ready to learn from them and share his experiences with them. A great friend, relative, and companion.”


He never lost sight of his family, as evidenced by this quote from an essay written by his granddaughter, Emily Holland:

“His life experiences and adventures have made him into an inspiring grandfather with plenty of wisdom to share, even if he is quick to disagree. Every time we have a conversation I end up learning something new about his life, which ultimately shifts my perception of my own.”

He met and interviewed Mother Teresa, Pope John Paul II, the Rev. Dr. Billy Graham, and Anatoly Shcharansky. He also participated in missions to El Salvador, Colombia, and Haiti. While marching for civil rights, he was jailed in Alabama.

Awards: Noteworthy newspaper religion editor by Who’s Who; Distinguished Service Award, Society of Professional Journalists; Chaver Award, B’nai Jeshurun Congregation; and Special Recognition, House of Representatives, General Assembly of Ohio.
